



Home Learning at St George's

Home Learning Club:

Home Learning Club is held once a week at Lunchtime. Pupils can attend at the request of families who do not have access to the internet or who may require extra support.

Attendance at Home Learning Club will be expected for pupils who do not complete their home learning tasks at home.

Personalised Home Learning:

At times, a teacher may set extra home learning for a pupil or group of pupils if they feel it could benefit the child. This can include tasks such as handwriting, Book Clubs, writing journals.
