

Home Learning - Curriculum Enrichment - Year 3

Please note that these tasks are optional tasks that you may wish to complete with your child at home that will enrich their curriculum experience.

Every term, there will be a Home Learning Exhibition, during which pupils can showcase their learning to the class and photos will be taken to put on the school website.

Term	Subject & Topic	Task suggestions:
Autumn	History – the Stone Ages	 What is chronology? Can you represent these three events on a timeline: The coronation of Charles III, cavemen and The Great Fire of London. Which would come first and why? Can you make a set of Stone Age animal top trumps cards: you could include: a mammoth; a sabre toothed cat; a wooly rhino Make a model of a home from one of the periods within the stone age.
	Art – Drawing and Painting	 Research the work of Vincent Van Gogh, select your favorite piece and explain what you like about it. Sketch, draw and paint a landscape image, inspired by Vincent Van Gogh
	Science – Rocks	 Go on a rock hunt. Collect them and see if you can organize them by their classification. Make your own compost bin Put some soil from your garden in a large clear pop bottle. Fill with water and shake. Leave the bottle for a week and see what happens to the soil as it settles out. You should find the heaviest particles settle first and the lightest particles settle last.
Spring	Geography – The UK	 Draw and label a map of the UK including the countries and capitals of each of the home nations. Make an 'animal map' of the UK. Visit another town or area. Take pictures of its main features and compare it to where you live.
	Science – Forces and magnets	 Design a game to do with magnets. Design an investigation to show what household items are magnetic and which ones are not. Design a poster showing all the different types of forces that exist and where they can be found.
Summer	Art – Textiles and Collage	 Research Alma Thomas and create a poster outlining why she is famous. Create a collage on the theme of Reflection. Create a collage that represents you.
	History – The Romans	 Draw and annotate a map of the Roman empire. Create a poster to show what did the Romans do for us and how they can still be seen today. Create your own mosaic. Design a Roman Centurion outfit that you can wear.
	Science – Plants	 Create an information sheet on how pollination works. Take photos of any plants you see in your local environment or part. Try to classify them and find out what their names are. Visit Kew Gardens and report on all of the amazing plants that can be found there.
