



- Cross-school moderation


We hope that you will make the most of the relevant development opportunities within this publication over the 2023/24 academic year and beyond.



OUR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT STRATEGY

Our school improvement strategy has been shaped through a shared mission to transform the life chances and outcomes of children within the SDBE MAT, allowing all to flourish, bearing fruit abundantly. We achieve this by ensuring that a focus on teaching and learning is at the heart of our work. We are committed to meaningful collaboration across our schools, so that the skills and talents that exist and develop within the Trust, can be of benefit to all. The support, challenge, and partnership we offer, will enable our schools to flourish and continue to develop.

Our school improvement strategy is build around the eight strands below:





Over the past three academic years, our subject networks have gone from strength to strength, and we are now in a position to facilitate subject specific networks that cover every area of the curriculum. As a Trust, we a proud to be able to utilise the skills and talents of the staff across our schools to work alongside our talented training partners when delivering these programmes. This has meant that our networks in 2023/24 will be delivered by our:

- Subject Partners Our subject consultants who are responsible for the strategic leadership and development of their subject network.
- School-based Subject Leaders Individuals who work in schools across our Trust who have been linked to each network to co-lead the sessions with our subject Partners.

Subject leaders from each of our schools have the opportunity to attend termly network sessions with their peers from across the MAT, and then each leader brings back their developed skills into their school so that other colleagues, and ultimately pupils, can benefit. This is not only a great way of training, but also brilliant in building relationships and getting teachers from across all schools in the Trust sharing ideas and best practice. At the beginning of each academic year, each Subject Leader identifies subject priorities for their school and shares these at the network. This allows us to develop a set of strategic Trust priorities that are similar across the schools and forms the shape of the input from these networks across the year. Through our Subject Networks, we have created links with Department for Education (DfE) accredited hubs. This has given us access to the latest subject specific research, initiatives and funding streams.

WORKING WITH THE HUBS

We have worked hard to develop strong relationships with the relevant 'teaching hubs' across our subject leader networks. This has enabled our schools to benefit from leadership and curriculum support, using the latest research-based approaches, many of which are DfE funded. Examples of our strategic partners are:

- The Computing Hub
- Whole School SEND
- Historic England Though our humanities network
- The Maths Hub

We look to ensure that colleagues from each respective hub attend our subject networks across the year so that we can make the most of these partnerships.









BESPOKE SCHOOL TO SCHOOL SUPPORT

Through our Subject Partners or school specialists that facilitate our networks, we are able to offer bespoke school to school support as appropriate. This might be to support subject leader development or to enhance certain elements of the curriculum. We want our schools to be able to access specialist guidance as and when they need to. This element of support is in addition to our core offer to schools and can be arranged by contacting Education Partner, Luigi Leccacorvi on Luigi.leccacorvi@southwark.anglican.org



Our schools are also able to arrange for a subject review, using our Subject Partners and or Education Partner to facilitate. Our subject reviews are designed to be supportive, school-led and help schools to identify their subject strengths and areas for development. They can be structured in a 'deep dive' style of approach or can focus on certain elements of the respective subject. This element of support is in addition to our core offer to schools and can be arranged by contacting Education Partner, Luigi Leccacorvi on luigi.leccacorvi@southwark.anglican.org

END OF KEY STAGE MODERATION

Our end of key stage moderation sessions are now well established across our Trust schools. Teachers meet termly within their respected phases to offer each other support and challenge as they look to make accurate teacher assessment judgements. As a Trust we have invested in providing CPD for our staff facilitated to trained local authority moderators so that we are using judgements made with external guidance. This element of training will continue to be part of the moderation support offer as we move in to 2023/24. Our moderation sessions are currently only available for schools within our Trust.

TEACHING AND LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT SESSIONS

In addition to our networks, moderation and specific school support, we offer a range of additional leadership development sessions. These elements of our CPD offer range from 'strategic leadership of the pupil premium' through to our 'curriculum development programme'. We will always look to shape this offer based on the local development needs of our schools and other relevant educational themes that we know will support educational development and school improvement. Our teaching and leadership development sessions form part of the core offer for schools within our Trust. Schools from outside of the trust are able to attend these sessions for the course fee outlined within this brochure.

COST OF TRAINING FOR NON-SDBE MAT SCHOOLS

We operate a simple but affordable approach to non-SDBE MAT schools accessing our training and development sessions:

Subject Leader Network Meetings (this includes three network meetings): £250.00 per delegate per subject.

Teaching and Learning Development Sessions: £100.00 per delegate per session.





Alongside our EYFS moderation sessions and annual EYFS conference, our EYFS network meetings provide colleague from across our trust with a comprehensive support programme matched with a fantastic opportunity to collaborate and share practice. Our schools can also access phonics and early literacy support from the Wandle English hub with some of our schools eligible for free funding. Recent foci at our networks has been developing effective outdoor provision.

Helen Lawlor has a degree in Modern Language Studies (French, Spanish and Linguistics) and has been teaching primary languages since 2005. She participated in the Network for Languages, London Schools Excellence Fund project, completing courses in CLIL, French Phonics, Storytelling in other Languages and KS2/3 transition. Since then she has been involved in French upskilling training for Greenwich Borough, running a Primary Languages Network Hub and is co-ordinating an on-going collaborative project on transition with a local secondary school. She is regularly asked to speak on some of these topics at conferences/forums, that include The Language Show at Olympia and The Southern Primary Languages Show.

Janine works as a freelance consultant in primary mathematics. She has worked in schools, mostly primary, for many years with many different roles, including: subject leader, advisory teacher, deputy head teacher in a large primary school, question writing for national tests, senior lecturer, teaching post graduate trainees and GTP trainees, author of articles and curriculum materials, CPD provider for a range of LAs, schools and organisations and researcher. Her research interest is in the impact of high-quality lesson study on teaching and learning. Her core aim is to support the development of confident, competent and successful mathematicians.


